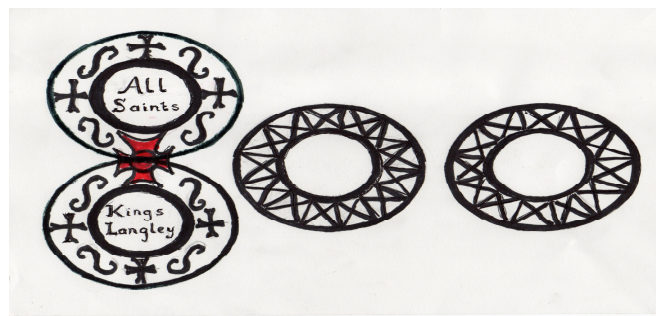
## PRAYERS
