Dear Friends,

Happy New Year! Today is Advent Sunday, the beginning of the new liturgical year and the start of the most beautiful season of the Church's year. Advent teaches us to wait joyfully and expectantly for the Love of God coming into the world as a tiny, helpless baby. Someone in our Advent group said yesterday "If God can come into the world as a human baby then anything is possible! Anything!". I like this interpretation a lot. As humans we get used to focussing on the worst-case scenario, we manage risk and make plans for if everything goes wrong, because we are vulnerable and we are used to having to protect ourselves. The good news is that it doesn't have to be this way - miracles can and do happen. We have a real hope, which is not just a vague wish for everything to turn out right, but a real promise that God is at work amongst us. I am always encouraging you to make more

space for God in your life, even if it's just 5 mins more per day. It won't surprise you to hear that I think Advent especially is a time for more space, more stillness, more silence, and less noise and fuss. We all know the reality of our busy lives, but the reality is no-one is going to make that space for you (quite the opposite!). You have to take control, and plan for that space before everything else crowds in. So, pick up your diary. Turn to the beginning of December. Look at the month ahead (don't panic! Just look.) Pick up a pencil and write in the daily time you're going to spend being quiet with God. 5 mins, 10 mins, a dog-walk on your own, the time it takes to drive to work, whatever it is. It doesn't matter when or how long, it really only matters that you make the time, and you keep the time for God to speak to you and for you to rest in his love. I am trying, and sometimes failing, to do exactly the same thing. A great adventure awaits us! I am looking forward to everything we have planned.

A reading from the Second Letter of Peter

3.8-15a

But do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day. The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance. But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed.

Since all these things are to be dissolved in this way, what sort of people ought you to be in leading lives of holiness and godliness, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set ablaze and dissolved, and the elements will melt with fire? But, in accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness is at home.

Therefore, beloved, while you are waiting for these things, strive to be found by him at peace, without spot or blemish; and regard the patience of our Lord as salvation. So also our beloved brother Paul wrote to you according to the wisdom given to him.
