Dear All,

I have been reflecting this week that we all have something that we are great at; some of us are brilliant bakers whilst others are great organisers. Many of us have "hidden" talents or talents that others may not be aware of because the opportunity for using them has never arisen. Sometimes we do not realise that we have picked up skills from our life experiences that can be beneficial in another setting or as it can be described as our "transferable skills". However, many of us will be aware of our transferable skills because we have filled in job applications where knowing these skills is important. This made me think that within Team St Mary's there may be many hidden talents awaiting to be revealed...talents that can be used to help fill vacant positions, increase numbers on rotas or simply help at our Church fundraising events!

As Harry mentioned last Sunday we are looking to increase the number of people who are able to be on Chalice duty and also to act as Verger at Weddings, Funerals or Baptisms; training, of course, will be provided. Neither of these roles are complicated but by being willing to do this you will in some small way be supporting our Church. For the Verger role we are looking to create a "bank" of people so that the load can be spread; we need people who are available from Monday to Saturday. However, no one needs to be available every day or even a whole day; for example if I was considering this role I would be available on Tuesdays between 9 am and 2 pm and Saturdays. At the moment we do not have these events on a weekly basis so no one would have to commit to anything with that sort of frequency; if we had many people then it wouldn't be that often that any one person would be called on to do their bit. Please have a think about your hidden talents and if you think you can help with either of these roles please speak to Harry or myself.

Finally, our fundraising team needs more help with the Family Fun Day on the 29th June- we need people to bake cakes, run a stall, provide goods for the hamper raffle and toys for the toy stall. If you are able to help in any way please contact Viv or add your name to one of the sheets at the back of the Church. What talent will you use to help with this or any other aspect of Church life? Have a think as you never know what you can do... Have a good week.

A reading from the 2nd Letter of Paul to the Corinthians 5.6-10, 14-17

So we are always confident; even though we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord—for we walk by faith, not by sight. Yes, we do have confidence, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord. So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. For all of us must appear before the judgement seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense for what has been done in the body, whether good or evil. For the love of Christ urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all: therefore all have died. And he died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised for them.

From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! This is the Word of the Lord.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ 4.26-34 according to Mark

GLORY TO YOU, O LORD!

He also said, 'The kingdom of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground, and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, he does not know how. The earth produces of itself, first the stalk, then the head, then the full grain in the head. But when the grain is ripe, at once he goes in with his sickle, because the harvest has come.' He also said, 'With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade.'

With many such parables he spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it; he did not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything in private to his disciples.
