Dear All,

Well, what a relief that the weather has improved, especially the increase in temperature! It makes doing anything outside all that more enjoyable so let's hope it continues until our Family Fun Day on the 29th. As we approach the longest day I am reminded of what people do to celebrate this. We often see, on television, groups of people marking this day at Stonehenge but given recent events I hope this has not affected what they would normally do. Of course, lots of people don't do anything different on this day and possibly don't even notice it but living in Scotland you do notice the difference in daylight.

In Dundee where I grew up the sun sets around 10.10 pm on the longest day which is over an hour later than here. If we have clear evenings like we have tonight it isn't really dark until after 11 pm; this is something that I do miss as you can do so much more with your evenings after a day at work. When I was still at secondary school we had a hillwalking club and one year we decided to ascend Lochnagar (a mountain well over 3000 ft high, near Balmoral Castle) to reach the summit as the sun rose at midsummer. This of course meant that we had to do the climb during the night...it was a brilliant experience and clearly one that had a profound impact on me. However, seeing the sun rise is not a guarantee and as we waited at the summit the cloud started to build but suddenly there was a gap in the clouds just at the right moment as the sun appeared - oh the joy and happiness as the crowd of people who had been as mad as us celebrated this simple act of nature!

We all have different ways of celebrating whether it is a birthday, a new job or any other of life's successes. We can all celebrate what we do as a Church as we support each other and our wider community; therefore, many congratulations to Father James, our new Team Rector. Also, please remember that next Sunday is a Team Service at St Mary's at 10.30 am. A reading from the Second Letter of Paul to the Corinthians 6.1-13

As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says, 'At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you.' See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labours, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honour and dishonour, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see—we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

We have spoken frankly to you Corinthians; our heart is wide open to you. There is no restriction in our affections, but only in yours. In return—I speak as to children—open wide your hearts also.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark 4.35-end

GLORY TO YOU, O LORD!

On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, 'Let us go across to the other side.' And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great gale arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, 'Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?' He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!' Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, 'Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?' And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, 'Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?'

Thursday's Readings (Year B)

The Second book of Kings 24.8-17

Jehoiachin was eighteen years old when he began to reign; he reigned for three months in Jerusalem. His mother's name was Nehushta daughter of Elnathan of Jerusalem. He did what was evil in the sight of the Lord, just as his father had done.

At that time the servants of King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon came up to Jerusalem, and the city was besieged. King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon came to the city, while his servants were besieging it; King Jehoiachin of Judah gave himself up to the king of Babylon, himself, his mother, his servants, his officers, and his palace officials. The king of Babylon took him prisoner in the eighth year of his reign.

He carried off all the treasures of the house of the Lord, and the treasures of the king's house; he cut in pieces all the vessels of gold in the temple of the Lord, which King Solomon of Israel had made, all this as the Lord had forefold. He carried away all Jerusalem, all the officials, all the warriors, ten thousand captives, all the artisans and the smiths; no one remained, except the poorest people of the land. He carried away Jehoiachin to Babylon; the king's mother, the king's wives, his officials, and the elite of the land, he took into captivity from Jerusalem to Babylon. The king of Babylon brought captive to Babylon all the men of valour, seven thousand, the artisans and the smiths, one thousand, all of them strong and fit for war. The king of Babylon made Mattaniah, Jehoiachin's uncle, king in his place, and changed his name to Zedekiah.

GLORY TO YOU, O LORD!

'Not everyone who says to me, "Lord, Lord", will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only one who does the will of my Father in heaven. On that day many will say to me, "Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many deeds of power in your name?" Then I will declare to them, "I never knew you; go away from me, you evildoers."

'Everyone then who hears these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on rock. The rain fell, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on rock. And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not act on them will be like a foolish man who built his house on sand. The rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell—and great was its fall!'

Now when Jesus had finished saying these things, the crowds were astounded at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority, and not as their scribes.
