

#### Dear Friends

Today is Passion Sunday, the start of the holiest part of the Christian year. Next Sunday we will hear of Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a donkey, to the joyful celebrations of a fickle and confused crowd. But today, Jesus is foretelling the kind of death he will die, and for what reason: "And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself". This is the great work of love, of reconcilliation, which can only occur through the free offering of Jesus on the cross. This is how people will be drawn to God, this is how people will learn to be the people of God once again.

It isn't going to be easy. I have a theory about why numbers are typically lower in churches (not just ours, by any means!) throughout Lent and especailly in Holy Week - it's because it's hard. It doesn't make much sense alongside the other stuff that's going on; the weather is nicer, the kids are breaking up from school. It doesn't make sense because, in our country, we skip ahead to Easter and start seeing fluffy bunnies and easter eggs in the shops immediately after Valentine's Day. It doesn't make sense because we are an increasingly people who prioritise how things feel above all else, and how things feel in Holy Week is rubbish. Why would we go to church to feel rubbish?

Well... the answer to that question takes up more space than I have here, but essentially it is an indisputible human truth that you have to sit with the hard stuff in order to survive it and grow out of it in a healthy way. It's not about mawkish sadness, it's about acknowledging the truth and the reality at the heart of our faith: the loving suffering of Jesus.

He is inviting you to be with him, to stay with him, to sit with him, to watch and to weep, in order that you might fully know the joy of his rising on the Third Day. Please listen to his voice.

## Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John 12.20-33

### GLORY TO YOU, O LORD!

Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour. 'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say— "Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name.' Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.' Jesus answered, 'This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.' He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

## GLORY TO YOU, O LORD!

Very truly, I tell you, whoever keeps my word will never see death.' The Jews said to him, 'Now we know that you have a demon. Abraham died, and so did the prophets; yet you say, "Whoever keeps my word will never taste death." Are you greater than our father Abraham, who died? The prophets also died. Who do you claim to be?' Jesus answered, 'If I glorify myself, my glory is nothing. It is my Father who glorifies me, he of whom you say, "He is our God", though you do not know him. But I know him; if I were to say that I do not know him, I would be a liar like you. But I do know him and I keep his word.
