Who is Revd David Jones?

Sermon: "Keep Praying, Keep Trusting" Luke 18:1-8 The Parable of the Persistent Widow

It begins with "Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up."

I love that. Always pray, and don't give up.

This story of a woman who just keeps going, keeps asking, keeps believing even when it seems nothing is changing it's not just about persistence; it's about faith.

Faith that God hears.

Faith that He's still at work, even when the answer seems delayed. And I suppose, when I look back over my life, I can see that thread running right through it a call to keep praying, and not give up. I moved to the UK back in 1998, from sunny South Africa a town called Durban and began working for Soul Survivor Ministries. Those were two wonderful, stretching years full of worship, tents, muddy fields, and seeing young people encounter God in powerful ways.

After that, I joined Soul Survivor Watford, where I served as caretaker, youth worker, and later leading the 20s & 30s ministry. We built community, ran big events, and saw lives changed. But all the while, deep inside, I had this growing sense a calling to plant a new church.

Every year, I'd turn to my wife and ask, "Is it time yet?" And every year, she'd smile and say, "Not yet."

But then one day, God changed her heart and in 2009, we planted our first church out of Soul Survivor Watford.

We started small about ten of us but God breathed life into it. Within a few years, it grew to around 150 to 200 people. It was a beautiful, messy, exciting season.

And in 2012, I was accepted for ordination training, recognised as a pioneer minister within the Church of England.

During my curacy, I worked half-time for the church and half-time running the plant. And for ten years, we saw God do incredible things.

But then, after a decade, that chapter came to an end. The church was closed, and we moved to South-East London. It was a season of rebuilding and, honestly, not an easy one.

Two years ago, everything seemed to unravel.

Some of you will know that Mike Pilavachi, someone I'd known through and worked with at Soul Survivor, was found guilty of spiritual abuse and coercion. Around that same time, I was facing some deep challenges of my own. Eventually, I reached breaking point. I had a nervous breakdown, and I was signed off work for a

In that year, I stopped. I rested. I grieved. And somewhere in the quiet, God began to whisper again. We decided prayerfully to step back from ministry for a while. We moved back to this area. and I took a job at Warner Bros. Studio Tour. It was humbling welcoming guests, scanning tickets but it was also healing. God was doing something in me again.

And over this last year, I've sensed Him calling me back, back into ministry, but with a deeper compassion, a gentler faith, and a renewed trust that His timing really is perfect. You see, sometimes, God doesn't answer our prayers in the way or at the time we expect.

Sometimes, the waiting is long. But the persistent widow reminds us keep praying. Keep trusting. Because God does hear. He is faithful. And when the Son of Man comes as the parable ends may He find that kind of faith in us: faith that never gives up, even when it's hard.

So maybe today, you're praying for something that hasn't happened yet, a breakthrough, a healing, a relationship restored, a dream reignited.

Don't lose heart. God's delays are never His denials. He's still working. He's still listening. And He's still faithful.

Amen.
