Bible passage

John 10: 14-16

I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me— just as the Father knows me and I know the Father—and I lay down my life for the sheep.

I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd.

Thought for the week ...

Before we lived here in St Albans My family and I lived in the countryside, right next to a farm. On that farm they had sheep and each year there would be some tiny lambs who for some reason couldn't be fed by their mum and so they had to be fed with a bottle.

Each day when Amarah, my daughter, came home from school she would run next door, make up the lamb's milk and then go and feed them with a bottle. She loved to spend time with them and they loved to spend time with her.

One day I was walking to school to pick Amarah up. The school was really close, just a minute away, and I walked right past the field where the tiny lambs were kept! I tried to put my hand through to stroke them but they all ran away – they were obviously scared!

I picked Amarah up and we were walking home, back past the same field.

The minute the tiny lambs heard Amarah's voice they came running to the edge of the fence.

They recognised her voice!

When she put her hand through the fence to stroke them they didn't run away! Instead they came really close!

Why?

They knew her. They knew that she gave them all they needed.

And, they knew she cared for them.

What's more is she knew them too
. To me they all looked the same but she knew little things about them that made them unique.
She recognised them.

When Jesus said He is the Good Shepherd He is telling us that He is close to us, that He will provide all that we need and that He cares for us!
